

**Marcello Buiatti** is a genetics professor at the University of Firenze. He is the President of the Italian environmental association Environment and Work and has worked as the Italian delegate for the European Commission's Directorate General on Science, Research and Development.

**Fritjof Capra** is a physicist and systems theorist. He is the founding director of the Center for Ecoliteracy in Berkeley, California, which promotes reflection on ecology and systems in primary and secondary education. In addition to his research, Capra has been engaged in the examination of the philosophical and social implications of contemporary science.

**Daniele Giovannucci** is Co-Founder and Executive Director of the Committee on Sustainability Assessment (COESA), a global consortium of institutions and UN agencies advancing innovative ways to measure the impacts of ecological and social standards and diverse approaches to sustainability.

**Satish Kumar** is a nuclear disarmament advocate and activist. He is at present the editor of Resurgence and lectures and runs workshops on reverential ecology, holistic education and voluntary simplicity. He is widely known for his "peace walk" to the capitals of four nuclear powers Washington, London, Paris and Moscow.

**Tim Lang** is Professor of Food Policy at City University and Natural Resources and Land Use Commissioner on the UK Government's Sustainable Development Commission. He has a long interest in exploring issues such as food security, food inequalities and the differentiation between food democracy and food control.

**Serge Latouche** is an economist who spearheaded the "degrowth economics" thesis. He is Emeritus Professor at the Jean Monnet School of Law, Economics and Management at the l'UniversitŽ Paris-Sud. He is the director of the Research Group on anthropology, epistemology and the economics of poverty (GRAEEP).

**Manfred Arthur Max-Neef** is an economist and environmentalist. His human development model, based on Fundamental human needs, is one of his best known scholarly achievements. He is a council member of the

World Future Council.

**Gary Paul Nabhan** is an ecologist and ethnobotanist. He served as Director of Science at the Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum and co-founded Native Seeds/SEARCH, a conservation organization whose mission is the preservation of seeds and agricultural plants as well as knowledge of their uses. Nabhan was the founding director of the Center for Sustainable Environments at Northern Arizona University.

**Gunter Pauli** is an economist and entrepreneur. He is the founder and director of the "Zero Emissions Research Initiative", aimed at redesigning manufacturing processes into non-polluting clusters of industries. Gunter Pauli is firmly committed to promoting sustainable social, economic and humane development as well as a new concept of entrepreneurship which takes into account cultural, social, political and ethical values.

**Carlo Petrini** is the founder of the Slow Food movement and president of Slow Food International. He developed a new concept of gastronomy, which considers food as the result of cultural, historical, economical and environmental processes. Among his achievements is the creation of the University of Gastronomic Sciences in Pollenzo and Colorno, the first academic institution to offer an interdisciplinary approach to food studies.

**Jeremy Rifkin** is an economist and activist. He is the founder and president of the Foundation On Economic Trends, which examines emerging trends in science and technology and their impacts on the environment, economy, culture and society. Rifkin has advised the European Commission, the European Parliament and several governments on issues related to the economy, climate change, energy and security.

**Stefano Rodotà** is a jurist and professor at La Sapienza University in Rome. He has been an elected Member of the Italian Parliament and of the European Parliament. He has a long interest in data protection matters and he has been President of the Italian data protection authority, Chairman of the European data protection working party and member of the European Commission's group on ethics in science and new technologies.

**Wolfgang Sachs** is an environmentalist and academic. His primary areas of research are globalization and sustainability, environment and

development as well as new models of wealth. He directs the “Globalization and Sustainability” project as well as the PhD Collegium “Environment and Fairness in the World Trade Regime” at the Wuppertal Institute.

**Vandana Shiva** is a physicist, eco-feminist, philosopher and activist. In 1982, she founded the Research Foundation for Science, Technology and Ecology. She has also promoted the development of the movement *Navdanya*, which focuses on biodiversity conservation and farmers' rights.

**Christoph Spennemann** works as a Legal Expert at UNCTAD's Division on Investment, Technology and Enterprise Development (DITE) with a specific focus on intellectual property rights, technology transfer and development.

**Stefano Zamagni** is an economist and professor at the University of Bologna and Adjunct Professor of International Political Economy at Johns Hopkins University (Bologna Center). He has acted as advisor to Pope Benedict XVI and he is advisor to the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace (Justitia et Pax) as well as a member of the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences.
