Dear Applicant,

According to the [World Bank list of Economies](#) (list as of August 2022), candidates are divided into the following income groups, based on their citizenship and residence:

- low income;
- lower middle income;
- upper middle income;
- high income.

If you are a citizen from a **high-income** country, please read *Attachment 1* reserved for high-income citizens.

Should you be a citizen from a **non-high-income** country:

- Please first check your admission score. You are eligible to apply for a scholarship only if you have been admitted with a **minimum admission score of 80 out of 100**.

☞ Be sure to complete the admission process prior to submitting your scholarship application and, ideally, well in advance of the deadline.

- Submit the required supporting documentation, as indicated below.

STEP 1 - Gather the requested documentation and send your scholarship application

As citizen from a **non-high-income** country, you are requested to send to segreteria@unisg.it the following documents:

- an official affidavit issued by an Italian authority in your home country, such as a Consulate or Embassy, certifying that
 - you are a legal resident of that country
 - you do not come from a high-income background family.
- the scholarship application form (*Attachment 4*).

Please indicate in the object of the email “*Scholarship application, a.y. 2023/2024_Name of the Program*”. Documents must be sent readable and in pdf or word format.

The completed scholarship application must arrive in digital format by the deadline indicated on the scholarship public announcement.

☞ Considering that the process of requesting consular legalization for scholarship documents may be time-consuming, the translated and legalized affidavit may be received following the deadline, provided that it arrives before the start of your program.

The University can request further documentation to control the truthfulness of the affidavit submitted.

STEP 2 - Publication of the Scholarship Ranking list

The final list of students awarded fee exemptions will be published on the University's website (www.unisg.it) on the date indicated in the scholarship announcement.

STEP 3 - Provide the translated and certified affidavit

ONLY if you will be assigned a scholarship will we ask you to:

1. have your affidavit translated into Italian by a translator approved by the Italian consular authorities nearest your place of legal residence.
2. After being translated, the Italian consulate must certify that the document was issued by the appropriate local authority and that the translation accurately reflects the contents of all supporting documents.



Considering that the process of requesting consular legalization for scholarship documents may be time-consuming, the translated and legalized affidavit may be received following the deadline, provided that it arrives before the start of your program.
