The research focuses on the social transformations triggered by the Covid-19 pandemic in the Mexican state of Oaxaca through the processes of learning, re-learning and re-signification of community knowledge and skills. These processes have been required to cope with Covid-19 and the structural limits of the health and public welfare system that the pandemic circumstance has highlighted. Many villages of Oaxaca adopted several strategies to prevent and treat viral contagion, according to their level of political, alimentary, medical, cultural, and organizational autonomy.
