

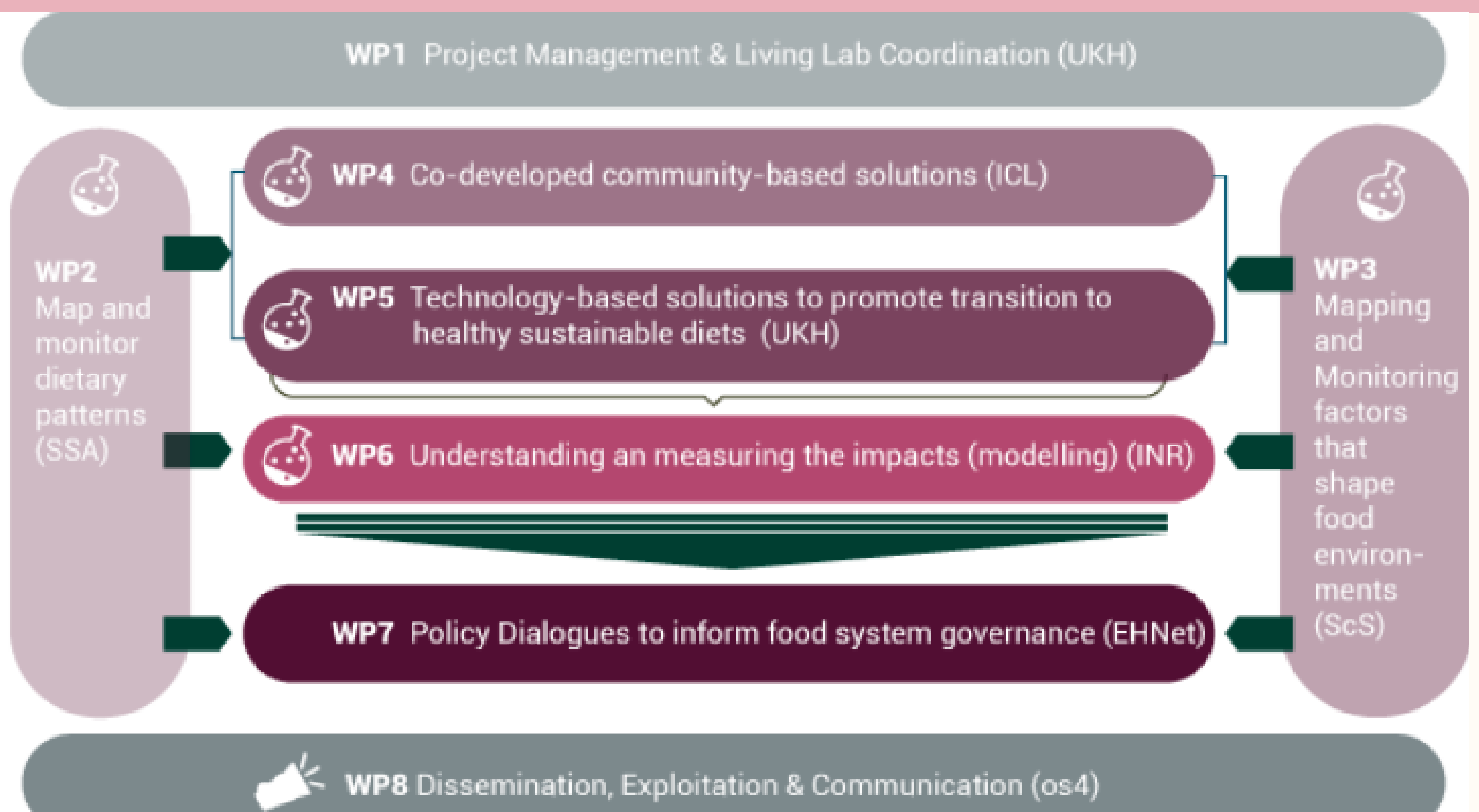
FEAST – FOOD SYSTEMS THAT SUPPORT TRANSITIONS TO HEALTHY AND SUSTAINABLE DIETS

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FEAST aims to catalyse Europe's just transition to a 'Win-Win-Win-Win' food system that sees major gains for people, the planet, and the public and private sectors.

Using a Multi-Actor Approach, FEAST will leverage current best practice and co-design novel solutions with EU food system stakeholders, including diverse vulnerable groups, to identify how they can be supported and empowered to facilitate and benefit from the transition to healthy and sustainable dietary behaviour at all levels and in all sectors of the food system



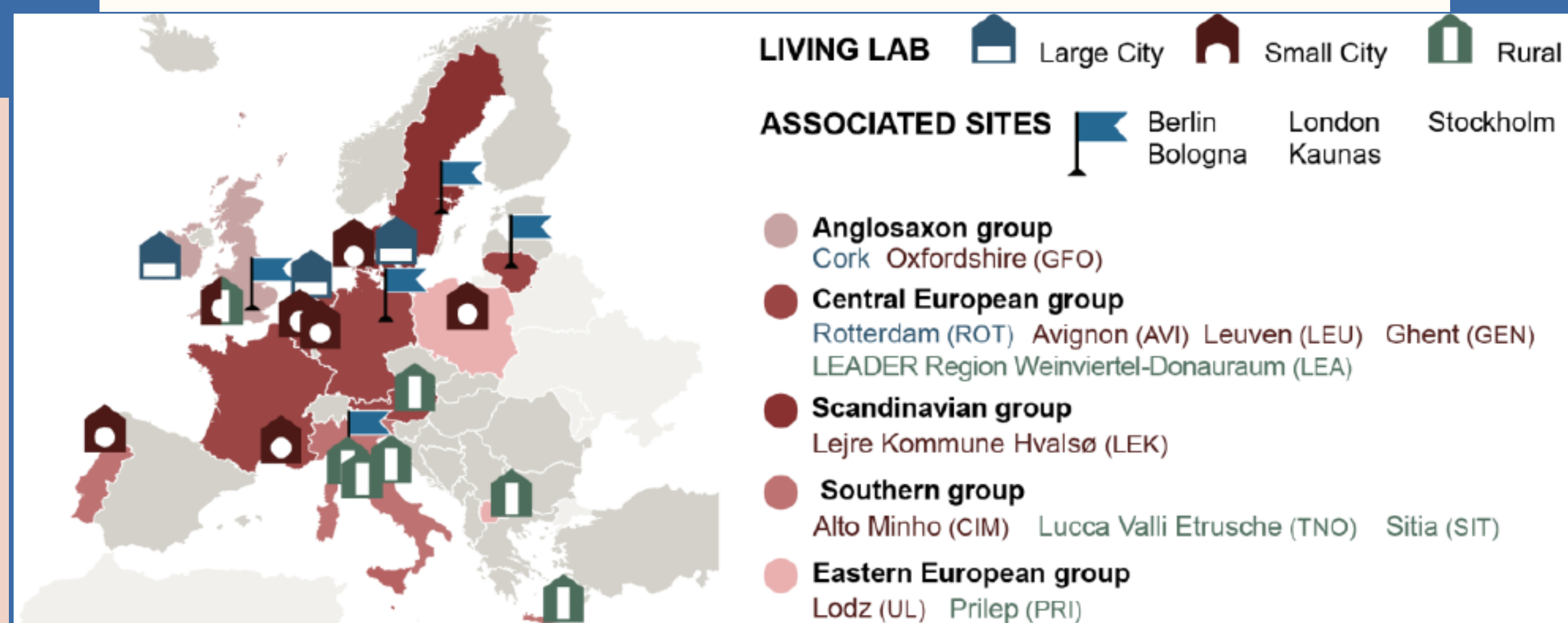
