Founded in 2004 by Slow Food, in collaboration with the regions of Piedmont and Emilia-Romagna, the University of Gastronomic Sciences (UNISG), in Pollenzo, is a private institution with legal recognition from the Italian government.

A dynamic university with a strong international flavor, UNISG is characterized by a diverse student body, with alumni and current students from over 97 countries.

This diversity of experiences, opportunities, origins, and encounters is one of the most distinctive features that contributes to the uniqueness of UNISG within the academic landscape in Italy and beyond.

UNISG's original educational formula brings together study and practice, books and life stories, science and rural artisanal knowledge, and is enriched by study trips that encourage exchanges with food producers across the globe. This methodological and pedagogical approach provides students with a *global vision* of food production systems and teaches them how to develop scenarios for the future of food in the world, allowing them to appreciate the richness of cultural diversity.

The university trains *gastronomes*, professional figures fully integrated into the contemporary socio-economic panorama. Gastronomes have an interdisciplinary knowledge and skills in the fields of science, culture, politics, economics and food ecology and are able to develop values, such as, the sustainability and sovereignty of global food systems, including all phases, from production to consumption.
